-Give hugs





1/2 Newsletter

Welcome to 2017! We are so excited for a fantastic year of learning. We have already settled beautifully into our learning areas and are enjoying the opportunity to work with some new faces. We are so lucky to have two classes, which means we can work in an open space with flexibility. Students will experience working in their learning areas, as well as in different small groups and with the other class.

The big word of the year is GROW and we have already had the opportunity to explore this word. These are some of our ideas...

- ♦ Our heart grows when we fill each other's buckets
- ♦ When we eat food, our brain and body grows.
- ♦ Our relationship with God grows over time.
- ♦ When we learn new things, we grow.

We can't wait to see all the 1/2 students GROW in confidence and happiness this year.

Last week we named our two classes. We now have the Boomerangs and the Vilijes. The students had lots of fun looking up different names and deciding as a class what we would be called. We will be referring to these names a lot throughout the year. The middle of our learning space is called Canberra (Aboriginal word for meeting place). We look forward to gathering in this space for different purposes. We also welcome Ange Crowe to the Boomerang classroom. She will be working in this space on Wednesday and Thursday afternoons. Melinda will also be supporting both learning areas.

Reminders

Can we please ask that students please start bringing their art smocks to school. We will begin Visual Arts this week. Visual Arts will take place on a Friday. Sport will be on Tuesday and on Fridays we will be taking the students outside to play a variety of games. Please wear sports uniform on both of these days. If you have any questions, issues or concerns throughout the year please do not hesitate to contact us. Classroom support

Starting from next week we will begin Reading Groups. We will have a timetable up for you to sign on the door under the Breezeway if you wish to help support us in our literacy sessions. We would love to see lots of parents helping, however it is a school requirement that you complete the "Parent Helpers Course" and have a current working with children's check. Please speak to Ange Crowe (acrowe@sjmitcham.catholic.edu.au), our literacy leader, if you need to sign up for this course which usually runs at the end of February.

Social and Emotional Learning

In Social and Emotional Learning students will develop an awareness of their personal strengths and how they can use them in their everyday life. They will explore ways of making and keeping friends and how these skills are needed in the playground and classroom. We will also look at emotions in ourselves and others and learn how to bounce back from difficult situations. We will be using the resources "The Berry Street Educational Model" and "Bounce Back to support our teaching and learning in the classroom. Circle Time will be held regularly and will be an opportunity where the students can express themselves verbally through discussions, role plays and games.

Mathematics

This term we will be exploring four core topics: Counting and Place Value, Pattern, Length & Area and 2D Shape. Through tuning in activities and small and whole class focus teaching groups the students will explore many key concepts in these topics. We encourage the use of Mathletics for home learning. It would be great if the students could use Mathletics two to three times per week.

English

This term the students will be consolidating a number of reading strategies such as stretching out words, chunking and looking for small words in big words. We will discuss the characters and settings of different texts and learn about different reading strategies such as predicting, sequencing, questioning and making connections to help us comprehend the text. We will be having a spelling focus once a week and we will be exploring how the combination of letters can make different sounds. In writing we will have a focus on the 6 + 1 traits of writing, learning how to make our writing more interesting to the reader. We understand that developing a child's oral language is important and we will be having 'Talk Time' which will be held every Tuesday. All students are encouraged to bring something from home to share with the class.

We encourage the use of Reading Eggs for home learning as well. We recommend 15 minutes at least three times a week, along with reading their reader nightly. It is important that you sign their reading record after you have read with your child, so we know they have read their reader to an adult.

Inquiry

Our inquiry unit this term has a big focus on 'identity'. We will be exploring this question as a class-"How do I belong to my family, school and the wider community". We will discuss how we contribute to the world in which we live and how others contribute to our world. Students will also identify what is similar and what is different in culturally diverse families. This also links with our RE unit "We Are One Family" as we will learn how we belong to the Church. We will reflect on the importance of belonging and explain ways people can belong in God's family.

Religious Education

Our other unit is Journey to the Cross. In this unit, the students will understand that:

- ♦ Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent.
- ♦ Lent is a time for prayer, fasting and service.
- ♦ Lent and Holy Week are important times in the Church year and are celebrated through liturgy, story, symbols and actions.
- ♦ Lent and Holy Week recall the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.
- ♦ Jesus' actions during the Last Supper demonstrate how Christians are called to be people of service.






The Learning Journal

This semester the 5/6 learning area will be trialling electronic learning journals, using the program 'Seesaw'. Seesaw is a student driven portfolio and provides the opportunity for students to independently document what they are learning in the classroom. They can show evidence of their learning using photos, videos, drawings, text, PDFs and links.





Seesaw not only shows the child's end result, but the learning process as they can reflect on their learning using their many built in tools such as audio recording, drawing and captions. Once their work is uploaded, it is immediately accessible to not only teachers but also parents. Teachers must always approve of any work before it is uploaded and parents get notified via app notifications or email when their child has uploaded a new piece of work. Your child's learning journal is private and secure and only you as the parent and the teacher have access to it.



The benefits are that it provides students with an authentic audience as they can receive real, timely feedback. It also allows parents to support their child's learning at home.



For parents to have access to their child's work they must download the Seesaw app. Seesaw is supported by iOS devices, android devices, chromebooks and kindle fire. You will also receive a signup code from either Monica or Tom, so you can access your child's learning journal.

At the conclusion of the semester we will be requesting feedback from the year 5/6 families about their likes/ dislikes about the app. Depending on the feedback, we will inform you whether other year levels will be using this program in the second half of the year.

Class Act 50 Task Challenge Building a Better Online World

This term the 3-6s will be participating in the Class Act 50 Task Challenge, which is supported by the Office of the Children's eSafety Commissioner. As students are signing chromebook contracts and agreeing to acceptable user policies, this challenge has been designed to support schools to consider and act on the issues the digital world can present. The challenge involves 50 quick tasks which prompt students to take control of their online safety and develop a culture of respect both online and offline. The tasks encourage self-reflection, group discussion and class action and will be completed as a tuning in activity during their ICT lessons.

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CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below is the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
- on the first day of Term two;
 - a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
 - b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
 - c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- * A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (27 January 2016) or term two (11 April 2016).

Closing Date

Parents are encouraged to lodge the application form by 29 February 2016, so that payments can be made from March 2016. However schools can accept parent applications up until 03 June 2016.

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents so please register your interest at the school.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

- Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.

 Make sure that the Surname First Name and Customer Refere
 - Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
 - If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- 3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.
