CAMP AUSTRALIA

Last week I was fortunate to attend a conference for Principals and school leaders that was titled *Courage is the Key – do the things you think you cannot do!*

The presenters were very high quality some of them were leaders in education, some in the corporate world and some everyday Australians who have made a big difference by their actions. I was inspired when I listened to the 2016 Young Australian's of the Year – Lucas Patchett and Nicholas Marchesi. These young men built a free mobile laundry in their old van to help the homeless. They established a charity called Orange Sky Laundry in 2014 and it now operates in over 36 locations Australia wide with over 270 volunteers. The focus is not only restoring respect and raising health standards for the homeless but also on positively connecting the community and improving the lives of others. It shows you what is possible if you have the courage to reach out and make a difference. I look forward to sharing this experience with some of our students.

Another powerful learning experience for me was the presentation from Hugh van Cuylenburg. Hugh presented on mental health and resilience. He spoke about three very important keys to resilience - gratitude, empathy and mindfulness.

Gratitude is the ability to focus on what you've got. Empathy is having the ability to put yourself in someone else's shoes. Mindfulness is the ability to shut off disruptive thoughts and enjoy the present moment and can help manage anxiety.

He left me wanting to implement some very important things they include: a once a week random act of kindness, practicing gratitude by writing down three things that went well each day and making time for regular meditation to ensure my mental and physical health is the best it can be.

Every Tuesday and Wednesday after school all staff attend Professional Learning Meetings (PLMs). These PLMs not only relate directly to our Annual Action Plan, but also provide rich professional learning for all staff.

PLMs we have run this term have been:

- Becoming familiar with the School Improvement Plan goals in the Wellbeing Sphere
- Analysing data from Literacy testing
- Moderating writing samples across year levels
- Becoming familiar with the Renewed Religious Education Curriculum Framework
- Reflecting on our Visible Learning journey thus far (strengths/challenges) and where to next
- Unpacking the Horizons of Hope teaching framework (this framework guides our teaching and learning at St. John's)
- Developing our understanding of HAPARA as a cloud-based tool to positively impact on students learning
- Understanding the expectations in Mathematics planning and using this to drive effective teaching and learning
- To plan for our History inquiry in term 2 and explore how we can connect this to the Religious Education Curriculum Framework

All PLMs our led by our leadership team members across all spheres-Leadership and Management, Learning and Teaching, Student Wellbeing and Education in Faith.

This term a number of staff members have attended professional learning days and networks and undertaken professional courses online in their own time. We feel it is important to share an overview of what staff members have been learning this term with the school community.

In February, Jacqui Marshall and Beth Johnson participated in the first day of an intensive three day program called Improvement Sprints into Action. This program focuses on a team-based method for improving student outcomes in our school. This program is facilitated by Simon Breakspear who draws on the latest research and highly effective improvement processes from both inside and outside education. This professional learning program will build on and strengthen our internal professional learning practices for our staff.

Naomi Curtis has participated in several Play is the Way professional development sessions including a full day workshop with the founder.

Play is the Way is a cross-curriculum tool for social and emotional learning. It primarily uses games and hands on activities to teach behaviour education to children 'using wisdom, not force'. Children engage in regular games that build resilience, collaboration skills, honesty and bravery, as children learn to have reasons for all the things they do and say. Play is the Way uses language that connects with children because it is simple, to the point and helps them work through the clutter and see things clearly. It aims to develop students of strong character and decency with the social and emotional competencies to live and learn well.



Each term, school leaders attend Network Days run by Catholic Education Melbourne, which guide leaders and support them in building their teachers capacity in particular curriculum/school areas. Early this month, Beth Johnson attended the Eastern Region Deputy Principals' Network which had a focus on Leadership in Catholic Schools.

Robert Brennan, a specialist in training, coaching and facilitating for effective leadership and teamwork was the guest speaker for this network. Rob shared his knowledge and expertise with the Eastern region Deputy Principal network on leadership and management, teamwork and team performance and workplace communication. At Jacqui Marshall's Principal Network meeting earlier this term she explored with her colleagues the book Pope Francis - Why he leads the way he leads by Chris Lowney. Time was spent discussing leadership qualities and the importance of changing minds to achieve mission. Bianca Martino, Jacqui Marshall and Monica O'Shannassy have participated in this term's Learning and Teaching Network. The purpose of this network was to explore how leaders in a Catholic School design for deep learning and powerful teaching to animate learners. The network provided an opportunity to increase familiarisation with the concepts of growth and progress and explore how powerful teaching through assessment can enable students to progress in all areas of the curriculum. Monica O'Shannassy attended the Religious Education Network which explored developing the capacity of RE Leaders to inspire and lead change for learning and teaching in our Catholic School communities by examining Horizons of Hope (Learning and Teaching Framework) document and the Renewed RE Curriculum. Ange Crowe's Literacy Cluster Meeting explored the future directions of Literacy in Catholic Education Melbourne and Kellie Cumming's Maths Cluster Meeting examined NAPLAN data and suggested directions for schools. Ange Crowe continues to have professional learning in Reading Recovery this term.

Kellie Cumming attended a Maths Talent Quest information session run by the Mathematics Association of Victoria. At this session Kellie Cumming developed a greater understanding of this national competition and how it can be implemented into St. John's mathematics program.

Bianca Martino participated in the Google Educator Group Meetup at St. Mark's in Dingley. At this meetup the new Digital Technology curriculum was unpacked and some new features of G Suite (or more commonly known as Google Apps for Education) were explored. Google have introduced CS First (Computer Science

First) 0where they provide schools with curriculum and lesson ideas to teach computer science to students. Bianca will be further investigating this and how it can be utilised at St. John's in the coming term.

Bianca is also currently in the midst of undertaking an online course by the University of Adelaide- F-6 Digital Technologies: Foundation. This course introduces the fundamental concepts of the Australian curriculum, such as algorithms, data representation and visual programming.

Emma Buis and Monica O'Shannassy attended a professional learning day titled, "Renewed RE Curriculum Framework Collectives Orientation Day. A team from St John's will join with two other schools in our local area to form a "collective" and work together to plan, implement and assess units of learning using new RE framework documents.



This Tuesday (28th) Rebecca Fry and Vicky Pejic will be attending a professional learning day on 6 + 1 Writing Traits. This model is an instruction and assessment tool designed to assist teachers to teach their students how to write quality pieces. Both Rebecca Fry and Vicky Pejic will be exploring the 6 + 1 traits (organisation, voice, word choice, sentence fluency, conventions + presentation) and learning about some great strategies to teach these to their students.

DIGITAL PORTFOLIOS

Your Digital Portfolio At St. John's, each student has a portfolio which is sent home with their report in the middle and end of the year. Portfolios are a sample of your child's learning across all curriculum areas and they showcase all the wonderful learning that has taken place.

We are currently looking for ways to present portfolios digitally from years 3-6. Due to St. John's being a Google Apps for Education (GAFE) school, students have become confident

and capable users of Google tools, often using a number of these tools such as Google Docs, Sheets and Slides in the classroom. As students are saving most of their work on their Google Drives (online storage), having a digital portfolio would be a seamless transition.

Digital portfolios contain the same content hard copy portfolios include but students learning is presented in a digital format. We are currently in the process of making a decision as to whether we stay with a hard copy portfolio or move to digital. We are seeking the school community's thoughts to make a decision. Why do emotions matter?



Why have we been focusing on Self Awareness and in particular, emotions?

Children grow and change in many ways during their primary school years. As well as growing physically, children develop socially, emotionally and cognitively.

Children's responses to the different feelings they experience every day have a major impact on their choices, their behaviour, and on how well they cope and enjoy life.

Emotional development involves learning what feelings and emotions are, understanding how and why they happen, recognising one's own feelings and those of others, and developing effective ways of managing them. As children grow and are exposed to different situations their emotional lives also become more complex. Developing skills for managing a range of emotions is therefore very important for their emotional wellbeing. Parents and carers have an important role to play in supporting children's emotional development. They do this through responding effectively to children's emotions, through providing examples of how they manage feelings, and through talking with children about feelings and how to manage them. In similar ways, school staff provide explicit learning and important support for children's emotional development.

As we end Term 1 and our focus on Self Awareness, please remember to talk with your child about -
