School Performance

Just over one week to go and the children are very excited. Today we had a full dress rehearsal. Thanks to all our parents for your support with costumes. School Closure Day - Visible Learning

Last Monday 21 August our staff visited two schools in Melbourne's north for our professional learning school closure day. Half of our staff visited St John the XXIII in Thomastown, while the other half-visited St Mary's in Thornbury. Both of these schools are part of the same visible learning project with Catholic Education Melbourne as us and have been acknowledged for the changes in their culture of learning.

At each school, we met with their leadership teams to hear about their journey and strategic planning to date. Following this, we were able to see visible learning in action in their classrooms. It is always a wonderful and inspiring privilege to be welcomed into learning areas and see best practice in other schools. On returning to school, we reflected on what we had heard and seen at each school and set some goals for the future of visible learning at our school. After setting goals for our whole school, staff also identified personal goals in their practice that would enhance visible learning for their students.

NAPLAN results

Our 2017 results indicate that we are well above or above standard in both years 3 and 5 in Reading, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation and Numeracy. Writing remains a priority area for improvement as our results indicated that we are just below the state average. I would like to congratulate our students and staff on this great achievement.

School Improvement Surveys

Last week we sent out 60 parent surveys and so far 15 have been completed which is a great start. Your feedback is valued and very important in setting future directions for our school. Surveys close Friday 8 September. Students in years 3-6 will also get the chance to complete a survey in the coming weeks.

Challenging the World

Tournament of Minds is an Australia-wide program designed to encourage students to develop their cooperative problem solving skills, and their creative and critical thinking. Here at St John's the learning opportunity formed a part of our Extension Education program. Our team solved two demanding open-ended challenges on the day. One was a long term challenge that the students worked on and solved over a five week period of time. Students had to design, create and rig a lottery that selected individuals to travel to Mars. Their solution to the Engineering/Mathematics challenge was then presented on the day through a ten minute dramatisation. The team also completed a spontaneous challenge on the day.



Interfaith Excursion

Dear parents and families,

On Thursday the 17 August as part of our Religious Education studies we visited two different places of worship. We met Rabbi Daniel Rabin at the North East Jewish Centre in Doncaster to learn about Judaism. We also visited the UMMA Centre in Doncaster to learn about Islam.

Firstly we went to the Jewish Synagogue where we learnt about Judaism and what life is like for people of the Jewish faith. One of the things we learnt is that women



were in the synagogue the boys had to cover the top of their head with a cloth. Usually males wear a Yamaka.

On Friday Jewish people celebrate the Sabbath. On this day they are not allowed to use electricity, phones, drive cars or cook food that uses power. During this time Jewish people go to church to pray and be with others in their community. It begins at sunset on Friday night and finishes 24 hours later. Jewish people follow this tradition to spend time with their families, their community and God.



We learnt about the three L's; Law, Lore and Light. The Laws are the Jewish rules or commandments. The Lore are the stories and the light is their relationship with God.

The Torah which is the sacred text of the Jewish faith is written on scrolls which can take a year and a half to write and cost between \$30,000 to \$100,000 to buy.

At the Muslim Centre we learnt that Muslim people pray five times a day; at sunrise, mid-day, late afternoon, sunset and before sleep. We learnt that the Qur'an is the book of teachings and scripture that Muslim people follow which has 114 chapters. The prophet Muhammad is a very important person in their faith and he is known as the last prophet. He is mentioned in our Bible in the Old Testament.

When praying men and women are separated, similar to Judaism. Muslim women wear hijabs to cover their head and hair. The only times they don't have to wear them is in front of their father, husband or son. Women make the choice to wear the hijab, they often do so to show respect and pride. During prayer Muslim people bow, kneel and have to face the direction of Mecca. All of this symbolises their commitment to their faith. Shoes are not worn inside the prayer hall.

In the Muslim faith there is a key teaching known as the five pillars of action. They are faith, prayer, fasting, charity and hajj. Muslim people are expected to donate 2.5% of their savings each year to people in need.

As part of the Muslim faith men and women fast for 30 days during Ramadan. They fast from sunrise to sunset each day. The reason Muslim people do this is to help them feel closer to God, to help them avoid distractions and to understand the pain some people who are less fortunate go through. Young children and sick people don't have to fast.

We learnt that it is expected that Muslim people visit the Mecca in Saudi Arabia at least once in their life. This is known as a pilgrimage and only Muslim people are allowed to go inside. When visiting men have to wear all white which symbolise all men being equal in God's eyes. If you can't afford to make this journey you don't have to.

Both of these faiths are monotheistic which means that they worship one God. Both of the faiths can also be traced back to Abraham. These faiths showed us the dedication and commitment men and women have to their beliefs. It dictates how they live their life, just as our faith should show us how to live our life.

We learnt about different perspectives of God in other religions. Other faiths see God as a king or a master. We are similar in our beliefs because we are called to serve and help others. We had a terrific day learning many things as you can see. Thank you for taking the time to read our reflection.


LIBRARY HELP WANTED
