Education in Faith News

Our Gospel challenge is to: forgive others.

In this week's Gospel Jesus speaks to us about forgiveness. It hurts when people treat us badly or make mistakes. We can get angry or frustrated. Before we know it, harsh words can fly. That's why it's good to keep our own mistakes in the back of our minds – always slowing us down when we're ready to judge someone else.

When have you received forgiveness? When have you not offered it?

READINESS FOR SACRAMENTS GENERAL MEETING OCTOBER 12 at 7.30pm

At St. John's Parish we focus on "family readiness" when children are preparing for sacraments. One of the things that has become more and more obvious to us over time is that any discussion regarding the readiness of a child to celebrate sacraments must involve a discussion about the family being ready to support the child. We believe that children need the support and encouragement of their family to grow to a maturity in faith and families need to be in a position where they can offer that support. It is in the family that they learn a sense of belonging, to celebrate and to know who they are. It is the family that first introduces children to Gospel values, prayer, Sunday Eucharist and in particular to the local Church: the parish faith community - by their participation in Sunday Mass and other parish activities.

We now believe that the best process to engage both parents and child in the sacramental journey is for parents to decide when their child is ready and if the family is in a position to support that decision. We will gather parents together on THURSDAY OCTOBER 12 at 7.30pm in the Coghlan Centre and spend some time exploring and unpacking the concept of "readiness" for sacramental preparation and come up with a list of readiness indicators as well as providing parents with a family activity book to support the learning that takes place at school and in our Parish Wednesday Program. If you feel your child is ready to celebrate the sacraments in 2018 then come along and join us.

After meeting with Maree, parents may collect an enrolment form for the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist. The onus is on parents to enrol their child if they believe they are ready. As part of our change involves moving away from school year levels and focusing more on readiness, we are encouraging some families who have younger children to think about whether or not their child might also be ready to take this next step in faith.




