2017 Track & Field Championships

Boroondara & Whitehorse Division Athletics

Congratulations to our eleven St John's students that represented our school in the division athletics championships last Wednesday the 11th of October. The day was held at Bill Sewart Athletics track in Burwood East, with students from schools all over our region competing on the day. The events were very tough between competitors, with all of our students giving fantastic effort and everything they had. We are very proud of the success you all achieved in reaching this stage. A special congratulations to



Hamish Gill who came first in both his events and will be competing next Thursday at Regional Championships.

Staff Professional Learning

Last term a number of staff members attended professional learning days and networks. We feel it is important to share an overview of what staff members learnt last term with the school community.

Wellbeing

Berry Street Education Model Alumni (Beth Johnson/ Naomi Curtis) - Continuing our professional learning from 2016, this alumni session gave us an insight into students and challenging behaviour. Understanding how the brain behaves when a student is in an escalated state and triggers/causes for this behave, including possible unmet needs of the student, enables schools to effectively de-escalate behaviour and ensure student safety for an effective learning environment.

Respectful Relationships (Beth Johnson/Naomi Curtis/Jacqui Marshall) - The Victorian government is supporting schools with professional learning and resources to develop social and emotional learning in schools to build a whole school culture of respectful relationships. This professional learning provided opportunities for us to explore ways to audit and ensure all aspects of our school are inclusive, equal and respectful.

School Wide Positive Behaviour Network (Beth Johnson) - network clusters are a great opportunity to work with other schools to introduce and strengthen effect changes to our school. This network meeting focused on successful strategies schools were using to acknowledge and promote positive behaviours in their communities.

Religious Education

Shifting Towards the Theological Normative Day (Monica O'Shannassy/Jacqui Marshall) - This was about deepening our understanding of Catholic Identity process and moving from theory to practice. Some ways schools can enhance our Catholic Identity is by ensuring the Catholic text (tradition) is placed in present day culture so it receives new plausibility and meaning, symbolism is strong and that we embrace the complexity of our faith and don't avoid it.

Religious Education Collective Days (Monica O'Shannassy/Jacqui Marshall/Bianca Martino and Emma Buis) - The two Collective days have been focused on analysis of unit design and assessment to ensure that learning is deep, transformative and assessment is directing our teaching and learning, is timely and purposeful. Staff have been exploring this in their professional learning meetings after school and sharing their units of learning and assessment tasks with colleagues to assist with the analysis. Student work samples have been moderated by staff to assess where students are on the developmental continuum and to develop teachers' skills in designing rigorous tasks. Staff are continuing their learning about the Renewed RE Curriculum Framework as they use the learning descriptors and achievement standards in their planning and assessing.

Learning & Teaching

Visible Learning into Action (Beth Johnson/Bianca Martino/Jacqui Marshall) - Reflecting on our journey and successes with Visible Learning and planning for 2018 actions. At this professional learning we gathered a deeper knowledge of the impact on student learning of collective teacher efficacy.

Learning and Teaching Network Day (Monica O'Shannassy/Bianca Martino) - This day explored building teacher efficacy, data walls, Case Management Approach to monitoring student progress and examining Ethical, Personal and Social, Creative and Critical Thinking and Ethical Understanding capabilities from the Victorian Curriculum. Learning from this day will be shared with school staff over a number of professional learning meetings.

Mathematics

Eastern Region Mathematics Network Meeting (Kellie Cumming) - The session was about unpacking the location thread of the Measurement and Geometry Strand of the Victorian Curriculum (Prep to 6) and developing a greater understanding of curriculum knowledge, skills and key ideas. This session provided the school with learning intentions and lesson ideas in the location thread (directional language, maps, position of coordinates).

reSolve - Maths by Inquiry Session 1 (Kellie Cumming) - reSolve: Mathematics by Inquiry is a bold new national program to promote innovative and engaging approaches to the teaching and learning of mathematics in Australian schools. It is managed by the Australian Academy of Science in collaboration with the Australian Association of Mathematics Teachers, and funded by the Australian Government Department of Education and Training.

The project is a key component in the National STEM School Education Strategy 2016–2026. It furthers the goals of ensuring that all students finish school with strong knowledge in mathematics, and ensuring that students are inspired and equipped to take on more challenging STEM subjects, including intermediate and advanced mathematics in the senior school.

The reSolve project incorporates teaching and professional resources and provides rich engaging student tasks in a purposeful context. St. John's students P to 6 will be actively involved in some of these maths tasks during Term 4 and Term 1 2018.

Literacy

Literacy Network Day (Ange Crowe) - The focus for the Literacy Network Day was centered around Differentiating Writing in the Classroom using a range of strategies eg: Modelled Writing, Guided Writing, Shared Writing and Independent Writing to meet all students' learning needs. I will be feeding back from this day in Week 3 at PLM and working with staff to deepen their knowledge of a differentiated classroom and allowing the opportunity to make and reflect on adjustments in their classrooms to improve student outcomes.

Reading Recovery Days (Ange Crowe) - The Reading Recovery network was based on adjusting help in response to the learner.

eLearning

eLearning Network Day (Bianca Martino) - The focus for this network day was the Digital Technologies curriculum. As a network we looked at how we could implement this curriculum in our school setting as well as make links between the content in this curriculum and other parts of the Victorian curriculum.

Bianca Martino, Emma Buis, Naomi Curtis, Rebecca Fry and Connie Pearse attended the EdTechTeam Summit over a two day period during the holidays. We look forward to sharing our learning with you about this in next week's newsletter.



Walk to School Week



On Friday the 13th of October, as part of Walk to School month students, teachers and families from St. John's walked to school from Walker Park, Halliday Park and Charles Rooks Reserve to school. The day is about encouraging students to walk, ride or scoot to school to build healthy habits.

The people walking from Charles Rooks Reserve started at 7:45am and the people walking at Halliday Park and Walker Park started at 8:00am and a lap of the oval!

When we got to school from the walk, we ate our breakfast.

PREPIERWANEWSLEITER

Welcome back everyone! This term students are required to wear summer uniform including hats and sunscreen. Get ready for a brilliant last term in Prep.

LIVERACY

In term 4 our literacy block will continue to consist of Reading Groups and Writing, yet this term we will learn more about comprehension, retelling and text types. Students will learn about fiction and nonfiction texts and their common features. Please let me stress the importance of reading every night with your child and talking about the text.

MATHS

The first day of term marked day 141 of school for the preps. We will continue to count each day and see if any of our estimates were close. This term we will be revising the topics of Time and 3D objects and also exploring some new topics. These new topics include:

Fractions – understanding, modelling and explain halves and quarters as equal parts that make up a whole.

Mass – using hefting to determine which object is heavier.

Chance – describing how events are likely or unlikely to occur.

Money – recognizing Australian coins and notes and representing simple financial situations involving money.





INDUIRYANDRELIGIOUSEDUCATION

Our Inquiry this term will be centred around Science. We will particularly be focusing on Biological Science and each week will also conduct a simple experiment to increase our understanding of Chemical Science. We will again be linking our Inquiry unit with Religious Education so this term will see us further exploring the wonderful world around us and how we can care for it. We will learn about animals and simple life cycles and wonder about God's Creation.

As part of a separate unit in Religious Education the students will also learn about some key figures from the Old Testament such as Moses and David, listening to more stories of God's people and hearing how God protected them. Students will hear more stories about the life of Jesus and reflect on ways Jesus shows us how to relate to and understand one another. Later in the term students will learn about the special time of Advent and will prepare for the birth of Jesus.

SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL LEARNING

In term 4 our SEL will fall under the Social Management umbrella where we will learn about problem solving and building resilience. Students will learn that problems are a normal part of life but that problems can almost always be solved. Students will also learn about inclusion and differences and build a better understanding of how to manage their social situations. Each day we will continue to use brain breaks and mindfulness activities so we can stay focused and ready to learn.




Term 4

1/2 Newsletter

Welcome to Term 4!

We can't believe it's the last term for the year! We hope you all had a restful holiday and are excited to be back at school. We are so excited for a fantastic term of learning. We also have many exciting events coming up, with an insightful excursion to Scienceworks planned for week 4 and a few guest speakers.

We continue to welcome parent helpers to support us in Reading Groups. Please write your name down next to a time under the Breezeway. It has been great to see so many students completing tasks on Reading Eggs & Mathletics. We encourage all to work through these to support learning in the classroom.



Inquiry & Religious Education

This term our inquiry focus is based on the Science domain of the Humanities curriculum and we will be exploring Earth & Space Science. In this unit students will have the opportunity to learn about the differences in day and night and learn about the characteristics of the eight planets in the solar system. We will also touch on natural disasters. On Monday 30th October we will be going on an excursion to Scienceworks. Here we will explore the museum and take part in a program called 'Tycho to the Moon'. Students will visit the planetarium and learn about space travel, the phases of the Moon and features of the lunar surface and Sun. They will also take a close up look of the Sun, watching the effects of gravity and seeing the Earth from space. We hope this excursion will provide some rich language that the students will use and refer to throughout the unit.

This unit links with our RE unit 'Our Community' where students will reflect on how we can be stewards of creation. We will also explore key scripture stories of love and care for the environment and stories on Jesus' forgiveness and compassion for the community. Students will also learn that 'Advent' is a time for waiting, hoping and preparation for the birth of Jesus Christ.

Just a reminder that term four is a hat term, so all students are expected to wear their hats on the playground and if they do not have a hat, they will have to play in the shaded area in the passive play.

Social & Emotional Learning

In Social and Emotional Learning we will be exploring the area of Social Management.

This involves looking at skills required for participation in group tasks and being able to discuss our contribution to a group. Students will learn how to interact respectfully with adults and peers and recognise that conflicts can occur in different situations. The skills they will learn are negotiating with others, working in teams, collaborative decision making, resolving conflicts and leadership skills.




English

In writing we will spend a number of weeks learning about information writ-

ing. Students will learn the features of

scientific reports and procedures and



ualising.

In spelling we will continue to learn about blends, silent letters, syllables and visual memory to spell familiar and unfamiliar words. We will also explore compound words - when two words are combined to form a new word and homophones - when two words sound the same but have different meanings eq. one and won. Handwriting will continue to be a weekly focus.



Mathematics

In Maths we will be consolidating our numeracy skills in a number of areas, revisiting topics and learning new concepts. This term we will be learning more about the four following areas:

Volume & Capacity - measure and compare the capacities of pairs of objects using formal and informal units. Fractions and Decimals - recognising and interpreting equal parts of a whole and relating the number of parts to the size of a fraction.

Chance - exploring the likelihood of events occurring and describing the probability of events occurring using chance language. For example, likely and unlikely. Money - recognise, describe, count and order Australian coins and notes according to their value.

The last two weeks we will be revisiting these three topics: Counting - skip counting by 2s, 3s, 4s, 5s, 10s forwards and backwards and from different starting points. Place Value - exploring that numbers can be broken up in many ways eg. 154 is the same as 15 tens and 4 ones or 14 tens and 14 ones.

Patterns - learning the difference between repeated and growing patterns.



Digital Technologies

This term, students will continue to learn about being safe and responsible users of digital technologies. Students will continue to practice their typing skills such as correct finger placement using the programs Typing Club and Keyboard Climber, They will continue to consolidate their understanding of Drive, Docs, Drawings and Forms and will learn about Google Sheets and Slides.



Visual Arts

In Visual Arts students will be looking at the artist Pablo Picasso. We will explore his colour choice and use of shapes. We will also interpret his art work by producing our own creative pieces.

Students will continue to develop art techniques such as cutting, drawing, painting and scrunching paper. We will continue to use a variety of mediums such as cardboard and chalk to produce art.

3/4 Term 4 Newsletter

Innovative— Why is it so? When our understanding grows, our

knowledge grows

In Inquiry this term we will be focusing on Biological Sciences. Students will explore the following concepts:

- -The difference between living and nonliving things
- -Adaptations of different marine animals
- -Different animals have different life cycles
- -The environment is important in protecting life cycles and survival of animals

After researching, students will independently create a poster/digital presentation for a chosen marine animal including their life cycle, physical appearance and attributes, habitat, diet, threats and classification.



Religious Education

In RE, we will be linking our learning with our science inquiry unit through a focus on the Catholic Social Teaching - Stewardship. The big questions we will be focusing on is: How do I show respect for creation? Students will be reflecting on the sacredness of creation and what we can do protect our environment. Students will then go on to explore how God is revealed in the activity of the Holy Spirit- creation, church and the human experience. Students will conclude the unit by devising a school wide campaign on an environmental issue.



Literacy

In Term 4 Writing, we will be continuing to use the 6+1 Writing Traits to write informative scientific reports.

We will have a continued focus on using the writing process - plan, draft, confer/revise, edit and publish.

In reading groups, students will continue to work on a range of comprehension, spelling and handwriting activities. We have introduced the new rotation of writing, students will be using writing prompts to improve their word choice and ideas.

Spelling groups will continue each Monday to target specific spelling rules and letter blends. Students will work in groups and participate in a range of activities focused on the specific spelling rule or blend. This will be supported through the use of the SpellBoard app on the iPad during reading rotations.

3/4 Term 4 Newsletter

Mathematics

Through independent, small and large group activities students will explore the following concepts:

Division

Recognise and understand the inverse relationship between multiplication and division.

For example: 3X4=12 therefore 12/3=4.

Use a range of strategies to solve multiplication and division equations.

Capacity

Estimate, order and measure the capacity of containers to the nearest litre.

Chance and Data

Describe possible everyday events and order their chances of occurring.

Identify events where the chance of one will not be affected by the occurrence of the other (for example, flipping a heads or tail in a coin toss).

Money

Count and order small collections of Australian coins and notes according to their value.

Use a combination of coins and notes to represent money values in multiple ways.

Time

Read the time on analogue clocks using analogue language eg. 20 past 10.

Read the time on analogue clocks using digital language eg. 4:40.

Social and Emotional Learning (SEL)

During term 4, students will be identifying and exploring their identities and developing and understanding of who they are in the world. Through a range of activities, students will name and describe factors that contribute to their identity.

Later in the term students will explore positive relations. They will describe and demonstrate what respectful and inclusive behaviours look like in action and assess conflict situations and consider possible responses. To further this knowledge students will describe and practice help-seeking skills and strategies that can be used when encountering uncomfortable or unsafe situations.



Home Learning

- -We encourage daily reading at home with a minimum of at least three nights signed and recorded in diaries. This should include both independent reading and reading aloud.
- Fortnightly Home Learning sheet.
- -Ongoing Mathletics tasks will be set for students to complete at home. These tasks will relate to what has been covered in class and assist students in consolidating what they have learnt.

Year Five/Six Term Four Newsletter

Welcome back to the last term of the 2017 school year and for some families last term of primary school. The term is sure to fly by with some engaging learning experiences planned and a busy calendar of community events, including Mini missions and the St John's Parish Fete. A portion of our learning time will be focused on transition for Year Sixes and Leadership for Year Fives.

Inquiry

Our fourth term inquiry unit titled "Innovation - Why is it so?" will have a strong biological science theme and align closely with Ethical understanding and Religious Education learning. Students will be exploring living things and adaptations that help them to survive in their environment. We will be investigating animals that live in different places around the world, the habitats and behaviours that they display and how they are impacted by the physical conditions of their environment. As part of this unit of learning students will be visiting Healesville Sanctuary, on Monday 23rd October, to participate in the Fighting Extinction Challenge. Students will learn about key species and threats they face in the wild, they will be presented with the inquiry question "How can you fight extinction?".





Religious Education

Students will be exploring the Catholic Social Teaching principles of Stewardship of Creation and Preferential Option for the Poor. We will be examining issues of morality and justice and discussing our roles and responsibilities in building just communities. We will be researching some of our church's saints and how we can be modern day saints.

Literacy

This term, the senior students will look to develop their reading, speaking and listening and writing skills through a variety of activities and programs.



Our literacy rotation activities and teacher lead focus groups will continue this term to develop student reading skills.


This term we will be continuing to focus on the 6+1 traits in writing, using our learning of these traits to assist as we focus on nonfiction writing. We will be linking our inquiry learning to writing information reports and procedural texts. Within this we will be focusing on sentence fluency, organisation and grammar.

<u>Maths</u>

The following curriculum topics will be taught this term:

- Division
- Solids 3D Objects
- Volume, capacity & mass
- Decimals and percentages
- Statistics
- Fractions
- Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division



STEM - Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths

This term we are building on our exploration of Earth and Space Science focus on Natural Disasters from last term to create a sustainable design for rebuilding a community following a natural disaster. We will investigate different technologies and their strengths and uses and use our engineering skills and maths understandings to create a design for community to withstand future natural disaster occurrences. Your children are collaborating on a school-based (private only to SJM students) Google Classroom where you can share with them some of their learning from last term and as they continue with this unit.

Social and Emotional Learning

The SEL focus for this term is on building healthy, respectful relationships and collaboration. In this social management unit the students will identify causes and effects of conflict and explore different strategies for diffusing or resolving conflict situations.

Home Learning

Mathletics is an important part of our mathematics program. We have noticed that some students are not completing their ten set tasks set each fortnight. Research has found and we would agree, that using Mathletics positively affects their overall progress in maths. Please support us with by encouraging students to meet these expectations.

Home learning will continue to be given to students fortnightly and follow the same structure as it has all year. We will be linking the learning we do at school with our tasks for home learning where possible and incorporating tasks students can do at home with their family members.

Specialist classes for Performing Arts and Italian are on Wednesday,


