ITALIAN NEWSLETTER TERM 4

BENVENUTI A TRIMESTRE4 IN ITALIANO. (WELCOME TO TERM 4 ITALIAN)

Students continue their Italian language learning this busy term with energy and enthusiasm as they prepare for our Italian Concert which will be held on Wednesday 22 November at 2.30 pm. Keep the date free!

<u>PREP</u>

The Prep students continue their learning of Italian through stories focused on family, pets, Italian foods, meal times and dining rituals. We are learning about "II Pappagallo" the cheeky, pet cockatoo. They listen actively to the sounds of Italian, repeat familiar expressions and are beginning to write more Italian words to label their pictures. Prep are learning a short play about the pet cockatoo as well as a famous Italian Christmas song, "Tu Scendi Dalle Stelle" for the St John's Christmas Carrols Night.

<u>YEAR 1 /2</u>

In year 1 /2 students are very busy rehearsing their play, "La Gallinella Rossa" (The Little Red Hen), using their animal masks. They are singing several songs and learning two new songs, one a christmas song, "Tu Scendi Dalle Stelle". If you wish you can find a children's version on Youtube and practise with your children! Students are continuing to practise their listening, understanding, speaking and reading Italian through stories, language games, songs and classroom expressions.

<u>YEAR 3 /4</u>

We are enjoying exploring the language of clothing in the year 3 /4 classes. After learning the vocabulary for many items of clothing students are describing what they are wearing and what others are wearing. Students are reading descriptions of what young people are wearing, demonstrating understanding by accurately drawing the outfits. Students are preparing a fashion parade for our Italian concert, so your child may ask to bring some clothes to school.

<u>YEAR 5 /6</u>

In semester two students have been learning about Italian food, comparing Melbourne's food multiculture to Italy's momoculture. They looked at the difference between their own school lunches and those of Italy and France, where a 3 course freshly cooked lunch is provided for students.. Students are learning the vocabulary of food and eating, meal-times in Italy and typical Italian dishes. They are participating in simple conversations about food preferences, learning to read an Italian menu and order a 3 course restaurant meal in Italian. The class translated and learned to read an Italian poem by John Lando called "La Fame' or Hunger. All students contributed to create an illustrated picture book of the poem, raising their awareness about world hunger and food waste. Year 5 /6 s will listened to, translate for meaning and perform a famous Italian Christmas song, "Tu Scendi Dalle Stelle", at our school Christmas Carrols Night.



Learning & Teaching

eLearning



On the school holidays, five staff members attended a professional learning summit run by EdTechTeam (A Google for Education Professional Development partner). This summit was a high intensity two-day event that focused on integrating and using Google Tools to promote student learning from years prep-12 and higher education. It provided our staff an opportunity to learn cutting edge best practices in educational technology. The summit featured world class Google Certified Educators, Innovators and Trainers. There were a number of sessions that each staff member attended. Some of these were...

Bianca Martino- Teaching Computational Thinking and Coding with Scratch (and CS First!)



I attended a session on computational thinking and algorithms (a set of processes or approaches that can be used to solve a problem). As a school we are in our second year in teaching and experimenting with the Digital Technologies curriculum. With this in mind, I thought it was particularly useful to come to this session as it focused on two essential components in this curriculum. In this session we explored how Scratch can be a powerful programming interface that can teach both computational thinking and algorithms. We also learned how you can connect Scratch to the physical world, through the use

of Makey Makeys. In addition, we were also introduced to Google CS First, which is a program that offers computer courses for students. Students learn how to code with the support of step by step tutorials, perfect for self paced learning. There are different themes within the tutorials that attract students with varied interest such as game design, art, fashion, friends and sport. I found this session very inspiring and cannot wait to start using some of these programs in my Digital Technology lessons.

Emma Buis- Story writing in the Digital Classroom

One of the GAFE sessions I went to was on digital storytelling. The focus was on creating "Choose Your Own Adventure" stories using Google Slides. We were given templates of story planners of varying difficulties and created our own stories. In order to make it a "Choose Your Own Adventure" we experimented with putting links on slides which could then be clicked and take you straight to the slide with the story option you chose. We then explored how we could digitally illustrate our story with Google extensions such as Bitmoji and Giphy for Chrome. I thought it was a great, creative idea which could be used for all students but would particularly work well as a challenge for extension writers.

Rebecca Fry- Math made digital and accessible for ALL students

I attended a GAFE session on ways to enable and extend mathematics in the classroom through the use of technology. It was a great session that allowed us to explore and investigate different tools and Chrome Extensions that can make accessing mathematics easier for all students.

Research has shown that mathematics texts and textbooks contain more concepts per sentence and paragraph than any other type of text. They can contain words as well as numeric and non-numeric symbols to decode and may also include graphics that must be understood for the text to make sense. In addition, many texts are written above the grade level for which they are intended (Barton & Heidema, 2002). With this in mind it is important to deliver mathematics in a range of mode from orally, paper and digitally. During the summit we were shown 'tricks of the trade' to enable texts to be read aloud, import mathematical equations into Google Applications. If we take away the barrier of reading and of terminology and the need to provide notation, getting in the way of our students being able to understand the underlying maths concepts.

Naomi Curtis- Supporting Reading and Writing using Google Chrome

One session I found particularly powerful was 'Supporting Reading and Writing using Google Chrome'. We know that children often measure their success based on how well they can read and write so having tools to support students of all ability levels is crucial so they can grow in their learning. The session explored more than 10 resources that can be used to support the reading and writing of all learners. I learnt about Text-to-Speech, which is built into Microsoft Word and all Apple devices, and has the ability to read back to you what is written. I also learnt about a website called 'Rewordify' that analyses a piece of text (copied and pasted) by looking at vocabulary, parts of speech, reading level and comprehension. In addition to the resources shown to us, I was also able to experiment with various Google Chrome extensions that can be added to your browser to assist in the classroom and at home. I found it an extremely useful session and have already used some of the resources and extensions in my planning and teaching.



Connie Pearse- Inclusive Technology: Differentiate to include all students!

In this session we were shown many different chrome extensions. They varied from Staying focused on the computer, how to block ads on the web pages you are reading, even on how to help children access and work on documents that will help them write confidently. This extension was one of many called '**read write'**. It allows each user to write a story with the help of word prediction, text to speech, voice notes, picture dictionary, just to name a few things it gives you access to. '**Adblock Plus'**, Blocks all ads to reduce distraction and clutter. '**Beeline Reader'**, Reduces eye strain, assists with eye tracking and is great for students as the font is in multi colour for them to be able to focus and keep on track with their reading. '**Mercury'**, This site is great for when the students are doing research as it removes clutter from busy websites, which helps them to be able to focus on the task at hand and not get distracted. These just a few of many, that Chrome Extensions has to offer and will be of great benefit to anyone using Google Suite. We are fortunate at St.John's to be able to attend these conferences
