## Social Management -Influences on Children's Social Development



Values are the internal guides we have for our behaviour. They help us to make choices, and to make judgements about what is right and wrong, good or bad, fair or unfair. While cultures differ in the emphasis they place on particular values (eg individual freedom or duty to family) there are many which are common to all cultures like respect, caring, and justice.

Parents and carers are children's first and most important teachers of values. Parents and carers can use a range of strategies to help children learn about social values. The following ideas can help.

#### Teach by example

Children often learn more from what you do than what you say. Your own behaviour is important for showing children how you would like them to behave. Talking about the reasons for your behaviour can help to make your values and expectations clear.

#### Read and discuss stories that demonstrate positive values

Choose children's stories that reflect the kinds of values you want children to learn. Talk about the story and what can be learnt. You might ask questions like: "How do you think that person feels? Why do you think he/she did that? Was it a good idea? How could he/she have done it better?"

#### Check what children are watching on TV

Make sure that the programs children watch and the electronic games they play are suitable for their age and reflect positive values. Watching violence on television and playing violent video games can lead to aggressive behaviour.

#### Teach children to learn from mistakes

Mistakes provide opportunities for teaching and reinforcing positive values. Support and acknowledge children when they admit mistakes and help them find ways to make up for them. Ask them to suggest ways of repairing any damage they have caused to relationships, people or property.

#### Help children to think about values

Talk with children about the social values and attitudes they encounter in everyday situations and on TV. Teaching children to question and think about social values helps them to be clear about their own values and strengthens their ability to resist pressure from peers, advertising and other media. Teaching children about values supports their social development. It helps them develop the knowledge and skills they need to play a positive role in society.



#### **VISIBLE LEARNING**

As we head towards the end of another year, students and teachers are busy collecting evidence of learning through a range of assessment tools. Assessment supports teachers, students and families in knowing where students are at in their learning, where they are going in their learning and what the next possible learning steps are. In the diagram below, being able to understand the purpose of assessment and using it to inform teaching and learning is critical in developing our students as visible learners. Our students are beginning to see that formal assessments, as well as informal assessment, provides them with feedback on their learning and a foundation for them to set learning goals.

Our reports at the end of the year and the Learning Folios provide students and families with a summary of the learning for the year and an opportunity to



celebrate their learning and set some goals for 2018. As a school we are proud to see our learners demonstrating the qualities of a visible learner - striving for, and demonstrating effective learning dispositions, giving, receiving and using feedback and understanding and valuing assessment to inform their learning.

#### ST JOHN'S SCHOOL FEES & LEVIES 2018

An invoice for your 2018 Student Levies will be issued in December and is payable by Tuesday 19 December, 2017. Family Fees and all other levies will be issued in February 2018. A statement of your school account will be issued again at the commencement of each term.

Fees can be paid within the following time frame:

- · Full payment at the beginning of the school year.
- · Three installments, paid by the end of term 1, 2 and 3.
- · Regular direct debits can be arranged through the school office on a monthly, fortnightly or weekly basis.
- · Direct payments through EFT/ Internet Banking.

The nominated fee payer is expected to commit to a fee payment schedule at the commencement of the school year. Please advise the school of any variation to this agreement.

#### FAMILY FEES

#### **SCHOOL FEES** – per family

School Fees pay for the everyday running of the school.

#### **COMPUTER LEVY** - per family

A Computer Levy for each family is applied each year to allow for the upgrade and purchase of new computers and software for classrooms.

#### MAINTENANCE LEVY - per family

A Maintenance Levy is applied each year for all families and contributes to the ongoing maintenance of school grounds. Families have the option of attending one working bee during the school year to receive a \$50 rebate.

#### STUDENT FEES

EDUCATION LEVIES Junior Levy, \$430.00 (Years Prep -2) Senior Levy, \$480.00 (Years 3-6)

#### **EDUCATION LEVIES** – per student

Levy payments are for items such as Excursions, Math, Science and Religious/Sacramental expenses and Sports equipment.

Education Levies are to be paid during the first two weeks of December, prior to your child starting school.

Junior Levy, year Prep - 2. Senior Levy, year 3 - 6

#### SCHOOL BOOKS – per student

Student books and stationery will be supplied by the school and billed to your school account.

#### **SWIMMING**

As part of the curriculum, a two-week, intensive swimming program for Prep to Year 4 is conducted at the Nunawading Swimming Pool and will be billed to your school account.

#### **SCHOOL CAMP**

Year 6 students attend Camp at Lake Nillahcootie for three nights in term 1.

Year 5 students attend a two night camp at Sovereign Hill, Ballarat early in term 2.
