Mothers' Day

School Closure Day

An important reminder that we have a school closure day on Monday 14 May. On this day staff will be exploring STEM Education, Literacy directions and preparing for our school review next month.

<u>NAPLAN</u>

The National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assess literacy and numeracy skills that are essential to every child to progress through school and life. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. Students will sit these assessments on Tuesday 15th, Wednesday 16th and Thursday 17th May.

The tests provide parents and students with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN tests are just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process; they do not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance. NAPLAN tests also provide schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are meeting important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

This year the NAPLAN test at St John's will be paper, however students in some other schools will be sitting their NAPLAN tests online. NAPLAN will be moving to online over the next two to three years.

You may wish to help your child prepare for NAPLAN by reassuring them that the tests are just one part of their school program, and by reminding them on the day to simply try their best. Child psychologist, Andrew Fuller's article titled, "Preparing for Tests and Exams" may offer some more detailed suggestions for those parents who are interested. http://andrewfuller.com.au/wp-content/uploads/2014/08/preparingfortests.pdf If you have any further questions or concerns, please speak to your child's teacher.

A Family Blessing

Lord God, We thank you for our families, Those who live with us and those who don't. Thank you for our brothers and sisters, help us to live together as a family. We ask you to forgive us for the times we have been mean to each other, or forgotten to help one another. We pray for your help to become closer in our lives together. We make this prayer for you, Christ Our Lord.

Jesus, in this week's Gospel, pleads with his disciples to love one another as he loves them. Jesus wants members of his community to sacrifice for each other and the world – even if we aren't friends and have trouble getting along. That means listening to others' opinions, putting their needs ahead of ours, putting disagreements or personality clashes aside, and focusing on our common tie – the Christian mission to make the world a better place.



Made in the image of God, humans are social beings. It is within the family that we first learn to build loving connections with others, based on the deep knowledge that we are loved. Sometimes these ideal relationships are absent, or they break down. At these times the Christian community needs to rally around to support the individuals and the family to rebuild deeper, more nourishing relationships.
