Education in Faith News

Our Gospel Challenge this week is to: make the sign of the cross thoughtfully.

<u>Trinity Sunday</u>

The eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teach them to observe all the commandments I gave you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.' (Matthew 28: 16-20)

Many of the prayers of the Church express our belief in a Triune God (three persons in one). One of the greatest prayers is the Sign of the Cross where we dedicate ourselves 'In the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit'. Although the Scriptures describe God as Father, Son and Spirit, many centuries elapsed before the Church formulated the doctrine of the Trinity. This formulation is enshrined in the Nicene Creed. St Patrick reportedly used the shamrock to describe the three persons in one God to the pagans of Ireland. • St Augustine described the Trinity as the lover, the beloved and the love between. When and where do you feel a sense of God with you? What is the stimulus for such moments? Can you see ways in which this understanding can help you in growing your relationship with God?
