"St John's School is committed to the Victorian Child Safe Standards"

Dear Parents,

We had a big week last week with our official school review. On Friday 8 June, we were audited on our Child Safety standards and VRQA (Victorian Registration and Qualifications Authority) standards and we are pleased to say we are fully compliant. One recommendation in relation to Child Safety was that we maintain its presence weekly in the newsletter with updates or reminders.

For 3 days last week, we were reviewed using the *National School Improvement Tool* which was developed from international research into practices of highly effective schools and school leaders. The *Tool* assists schools to review and reflect on their efforts to improve the quality of classroom teaching and learning. A big thank you to the staff, parents and students who gave time to talk to the reviewers about how our school is tracking.

We received a lot of feedback and over the next few months, I will share some of it with you all through the school newsletter. Education Board members will also have the opportunity to explore the full report at a deeper level. As part of the executive summary we were provided with Commendations, Affirmations and Recommendations.

I am proud to share with you the Commendations:

- Respectful, affirming and caring relationships are highly evident between all members of the school community. Students enjoy coming to St John's school each day. They feel safe, valued and important, with learning being a priority for all.
- The model of distributive leadership ensures the skills and expertise of leaders is further enhanced around their management and leadership of school priorities.

The VL Impact Coach's design of a VL Teacher Handbook, along with leadership commitment to being a VL school, will ensure the project's longevity.
- The active participation by leaders and teachers in the life of the parish and the school is evidence of their commitment and dedication to students.
- The linking of inquiry unit foci with RE across the school is fostering the re-contextualisation of faith and life. The REL and Principal are guiding the staff in deepening their knowledge and skills in being a dialogical, post-critical school.
- *Growth Mindsets is being used to enhance and underpin the learning of students.*
- There is an ongoing commitment on behalf of the school to affirm parents as valued partners in students' learning.
- There are significant levels of trust and support for the principal, leadership team and staff from members of the school community.
- St John's Master Plan has identified the areas within the external school environment and in the multifunction spaces that will be created to enhance learning opportunities.

Education in Faith News

Our Gospel Challenge this week is to: do an act of kindness no matter how small.

Jesus was a big threat to the people with power – all because he told simple stories like the one in this week's Gospel.

The mustard seed is a small seed that spreads quickly and stubbornly. It can take over an entire garden. According to Jesus, God's Kingdom can grow in the same way. It can spread quickly through all areas and relationships in our lives. Quickly and stubbornly, Jesus says, God can inspire disciples to spread through society working for the poor, the powerless, and the outcasts. That's bad news for the people whose power and profit is based on keeping others poor and powerless. So it's not that hard to see why powerful people wanted him dead.

Jesus' message is still explosive and threatening to people who abuse power and profits today. That's why Christians are being martyred throughout the world. That's why many people throughout the world sometimes feel like outcasts.

Does God's Kingdom invade all areas of your life – school, sports, family, work, friends, weekends, wallet? Do you let Jesus' values of compassion, respect, forgiveness, and sacrifice for the powerless take root in all those areas? The more God's Kingdom spreads, the more you might face resistance from some people, especially those who say Jesus' words are unrealistic or idealistic. But the more you get to know Jesus, the more you won't feel right unless you let it spread. Why? Because you'll see how your life more and more provides "shade" for so many people who need you. Assessment and reporting in Religious Education

Reports will be sent home next Monday. Quite often there is confusion around assessment and reporting in Religious Education. To put it simply, assessment in Religious Education focuses on the ongoing and continuous growth in a student's ability to engage in the deep dialogue between the Catholic tradition, the issues of the day and students' self-understanding. A student's personal faith is not the subject of assessment or reporting in Religious Education. Teachers design for learning that makes knowledge, skills and dispositions explicit and it is this which is able to be assessed in Religious Education. Effective assessment design ensures teachers consider a variety of ways to gather evidence of student growth.
