The Intervention Framework has a clear focus on the deliberate practice of teachers to enable all students the opportunities to be successful. It promotes academic and behaviour success for all learners through the systematic implementation of early identification, strategic support and scaffolded learning. It is premised on the belief that this can be best realized when teachers work collaborately in a team-based approach. As well as teaching in 5/6, Kristina is our Learning and Teaching Leader. She is passionate about music and the arts and loves helping students reach their full potential.


Since joining our school, Kristina has been overwhelmed by the support and unbelieveable community feel St John's has. She loves how everyone is friendly and looks out for each other.

### Our Gospel Challenge this week is to: be kind to all!

Jesus calls us to love our enemies, not *like them. We love someone when we act for his or her best interests,* regardless of our feelings. Jesus also says turn the other cheek. But that doesn't mean run. He doesn't say back down. Rather, he challenges us to find the nonviolent way to stand up for our rights.

These commands are tough to follow when we face people who put us down or threaten us. But we can do it through prayer and practice. We also need support from fellow Christians.

Jesus followed these commands. Look at the difference he made. We can change your world too by following his example. Martin Luther King's supporters refused to fight or hate when they were attacked. Instead, they often prayed and sang Gospel songs. That might sound crazy, but their courage inspired others to join them, changed some people's minds about them, won their rights, and saved a lot of bloodshed.

What are some practical ways we can show love toward enemies and "turn the other cheek" when we feel attacked?

ways protect their children from some of life's realities such as death and understanding how faith filled children are. One of our parents communicated how they found the evening extremely useful as they now have some language to use that would see the adult moving into the child's world rather than dragging the child into an adult world. 

## Behaviour Management Processes at St John's

At St John's we have a clear behaviour management process we use consistently throughout the school, in learning spaces and in the playground. This begins with setting clear expectations as a class. We encourage student voice in creating a list of expectations that everyone in the class feels important to be follow. These expectations incorporate our 3 Rs: Respect Self, Respect Others and Respect Property which form the basis of our school wide behaviour expectations.

If any of these expectations are broken, staff will refer to our Consequence Flowchart. The Consequence Flowchart describes three levels of behaviour with level three representing a highest severity of behaviour. If a student engages in a level 2 or level 3 behaviour, they will be given a reflection sheet to work on with a teacher. The aim of the reflection sheet is for the student to identify their wrong choice, recognise how they felt at the time and most importantly, reflect on what they could do better next time. Any student who receives multiple reflection sheets (ie. more than five in one term) will be supported in additional strategies such as a behaviour support plan or behaviour contract.

#### Behaviour Consequence Flowchart

#### Level 1 Behaviour

Interrupting others (physically/verbally), Off task Unsafe play (equipment, movement), Unintentional disrespect of person

#### Level 1

Reminder of a positive behavior you can use instead

Warning and asked to change your behavior

#### Level 2 Behaviour

Inappropriate language (swearing), rough play, reigniting a situation or intentionally antagonising people or situation

Damage to relationships/people or property

Repeated or continued level 1 behaviour.

#### Level 2

To be completed at time of incident when child is calm.

You will be asked to complete a Behaviour Thinking sheet. This is to help you understand how your behavior has affected yourself and others. This is also a chance to think about a better choice you could've made.

#### Level 3 Behaviour

Aggressive Behaviour—verbal or physical (Targeted), Excessive use of inappropriate language Refusal to co-operate

Serious damage to self, others

and property

You will be asked to complete a Level 3 Behaviour Thinking sheet and this will go home with you and be brought back to school signed by your parents.

### **Australia Computational Thinking** Australia Challenge 2019

Students in years 3-6 will again participate in Bebras 2019. The students will participate in this online challenge in a 45min (Years 5 & 6) or a 60min (Years 3 & 4) session at school which will be held between 4th - 15th March and 26th August – 6th September. Students who return a signed consent form will receive a participation certificate for each challenge.

Bebras is an international student challenge run by CSIRO Education and Outreach through the Digital Careers program. The goal is to promote Computational Thinking to students (Primary and Secondary) in a way that highlights student ability beyond Science or Mathematical skills. Using Computational Thinking skills doesn't mean thinking like a computer – it is a way of thinking that promotes problem-solving and it can be used in every aspect of our lives. It uses a number of skills that help us to do this, these skills include: Pattern Recognition, Algorithms and Logic. Bebras Australia is designed to be accessible and easy to use and is linked to the Australian Curriculum.

We use problem-solving in everything that we do – and future jobs will require this even more. Teaching Computational Thinking is not about how to use technology to solve the problem but rather how to understand the problems and identify the tools needed to solve them. Bebras is a challenge, not a competition. The aim is for stu-



dents to develop a positive impression about Digital Technologies.
