Faith Sharing Opportunity During LENT

On Thursday 21 March at 7pm there will be an evening with Fr Elio Capra on prayer and scripture with a Lenten focus. Elio is an entertaining and enriching presenter and this promises to be a great evening. All welcome. Coghlan Centre (Building behind the school) at 7pm.

Student/Parent/Teacher Learning Discussions

On April 2 and 3 (Week 10) there will be student/parent/teacher discussions. We strongly encourage students to attend as prior to these discussions, teachers will be spending time supporting students, enabling them to feel comfortable in sharing elements of their learning with you. At St John's we aim to give our learners increasing responsibility and ownership of their learning so that they can develop into independent, life-long learners. As part of the Visible Learning project, an element of this is students understanding where they are in their learning journey and where they need to go as a next step. This is done through shared analysis of assessments and goal setting in classrooms.

This process is an authentic way to encourage students to take responsibility for their learning, actions and decisions. This process will demonstrate to students that we, as staff and parents, positively support their learning and acknowledge the value we place on their views and respect we have for their opinions. It also clearly demonstrates that, together, we will support their learning and celebrate their achievements.

The purpose of the discussion/conference is to:

- Celebrate growth in your child's learning, wellbeing and achievements
- * An opportunity for your child to articulate their learning and learning goals
- * A chance for parents to engage in your child's learning

The structure of the discussion/conference is as follows:

- The conference will run for 10 minutes.
- The student, parent/s and teacher will be present at the conference.
- Students with guidance from their classroom teacher will discuss their progress towards achieving their academic learning goals, show evidence of achievement and share future learning goals.
- Parents will be encouraged to provide feedback to their child on their progress.

Teacher to lead discussion on planning for future growth in all key learning areas.

We look forward to this opportunity for students to celebrate their learning. Bookings will open next week.




On Friday eleven students from St John's attended the annual Mass for Schools, celebrating Catholic Education Week and St Patrick's feast day, the patron saint of our Archdiocese. The principal celebrant was Archbishop Comensoli who spoke to over three thousand teachers and students in attendance about us all being saints. He defined saints as "someone found by God," who spreads the Good News to all. Before mass concluded we were asked to dedicate our energies to ensuring that the message of Jesus Christ and the teaching of the Church will be kept alive in our schools.

"We commit ourselves to spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ by working together in respect, love and peace, making God's kingdom a reality in the world. Today we re-commit ourselves to catholic education and to caring for all those in our school community."

Following mass we were entertained in the Treasury Gardens by talented musicians from various Catholic Secondary Schools. It was indeed a great celebration of Catholic Education.







Our Gospel Challenge this week is to:think about what we are saying when we pray

Lord, You call us out of darkness. Fill us with your light. Amen

The Transfiguration baffles many people. Jesus and his closest friends go up a mountain and pray and during their prayer they realise the importance of Jesus and his mission. They connect his mission to historic religious leaders like Moses and Elijah. They feel God's presence. They go back down the mountain and head toward Jerusalem, where their insights will change how they live in the real world.



Our prayer life should help us be Christ's presence to all people - from the people in our schools and local community to the people in faraway lands. Lent is a good time to evaluate our prayer and worship life.

Is prayer a fueling station for our journey as a disciple?



This week students are learning about sixteen-year-old Peter who attends a boarding school in the Solomon Islands which has experienced water shortages for 60 years. Previously students would have to walk kilometres each day in search of clean water. This was particularly challenging for Peter who is living with a disability.

Peter's mother left the family when he was little and has since passed away. His father decided to move from northern Malaita to Honiara, to better provide for his family. He arranged for Peter to stay with his aunt, then attend Aligegeo Secondary School. Groundwater sources at the school have dried up and rainfall is unpredictable. Water in surrounding wells often made students sick or gave them rashes.

Caritas Australia, and partners Caritas Solomon Islands (CASI) and the Solomon Islands Government Rural Water Sanitation and Hygiene division (RWASH), have teamed up with the school to tackle the problem.

CASI provided a 90 kilo-litre water tank, electric pump and technical advice, while the Malaita Provincial Government contributed labour. Staff and students took part in training, dug trenches and are helping with a water management plan. The school now has a safe, reliable water system, servicing around 1,000 people. "Now we can stay at school to wash and not interrupt our official class time,"

Peter hopes to focus on his education and to help others in future by working for an aid and development agency himself.

However much more needs to be done to improve access to reliable water and sanitation in the Solomon Islands.

The money raised from our lap-a-thon on Harmony Day, this coming Thursday, will be given to Caritas Australia to assist projects both locally and internationally like this one.

Kindness means helping others grow (Oliver, 3/4)


Kindness is something you should always do and saying thank you to people (Elliot, 1/2)

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
