Our Gospel Challenge this week is to: forgive others!

Jesus offers Peter the opportunity to seek forgiveness and resolve to live differently in this week's Gospel. Peter denied Jesus three times. So Jesus invites Peter to repent and be forgiven by expressing his love three times. Peter has the chance to repair the damage his denials caused. Repentance can free us from the guilt that keeps us from fully loving ourselves and others. We can't really be free until, like Peter, we try to correct the damage our poor choices leave behind. We can also use those indiscretions to help others. Look at how the Gospel uses Peter's sin to teach us about Jesus' love and our ability to start anew.

Easter is a good time to correct and learn from our mistakes. The Risen Christ offers us the opportunity and the courage to look honestly at our mistakes, repair damage they caused in our relationships, and use what we have learned to help others. Let us take up Christ on this offer. And then follow him.

On Tuesday night we celebrated the first home mass for the year at Arnold's house. We attended the home mass with our families along with three families from St James, Vermont . Fr Dispin talked to us about the Eucharist and the mass. We talked a lot about reconciliation and we also talked about the Last Supper. After mass we all enjoyed a delicious dinner together.

Self Management

This term's SEL (Social and Emotional Learning) focus is on Self Management. The way we think has a big impact on our feelings and in turn, our behaviour. Helpful thoughts lead to more positive feelings and behaviours.

Unhelpful thinking can be common in both children and adults. By listening to the things children say about themselves and experiences, we can learn to notice and challenge children's unhelpful thinking. One way we are focusing on eliminating any unhelpful thinking in our students in our SEL lessons and interactions is through looking at personal (or character) strengths. Examples of personal strengths include bravery, kindness, humour, leadership, persistence and creativity. Encourage your children to discover their personal strengths through discussions on their strengths and how they can use these strengths to help others.
