Our Gospel Challenge this week is to: spend a few minutes each day to talk with God in prayer

The message in this week's Gospel about God being like a good shepherd is clear. We're in good hands – God's hands. Nothing can change that. We can't fall out of God's hands. We can't get cut from or kicked out of God's hands. We don't need to be rich or popular to be in God's hands. Why do we worry?

We can have a life of meaning and loving starting right now if we just recognise where we live – in God's hands. Who is this God? Ignore false images of God as judgmental and punishing. Jesus says he and God are one. So we should look at Jesus to understand God. We will be reminded that God is a loving, merciful, and compassionate parent who cares in a special way for all people including those most forgotten.

I'm not sure if Family Week is planned at this time of the year because of the readings on Sunday or even Mother's Day but when I was leading Children's Liturgy in my parish near home yesterday I was able to share the links of a shepherd, God and our mum's quite easily.

We are celebrating Family Week at St John's this week. "Building Connections in the Spirit of Hope" is the theme for Family Week 2019. Families are the number one support for the students in our school, so we want to use this time to celebrate and strengthen family relationships. We are at our best when we are connected to others and to the world around us. MISSION WEEK PROGRAM

A mission will be conducted by Fr. Ray Sanchez, a Passionist priest from Sunday 26 May – Thursday 30 May 2019. There will be morning and evening sessions (repeated) throughout the Mission. All morning sessions will be preceded by **9am Mass** this week.

Session 1: Sunday 26th May 7-9pm

"The Family and How We Communicate"

Our understanding of family has undergone many changes in recent years. Families are under enormous pressure, both form without and within and this affects our society and ourselves. We look at the issues our modern society confronts the family with, as well as the dynamic within it. We search for better ways to cope with change and communicate better within the family.

Session 2: Monday 27th May

10am – 12 noon Repeat 7.30pm – 9.30pm "Grief, Loss and the Mystery of Human Suffering"

At some stage, grief and loss situations confront us all. Suffering in one form or another is part of our human condition. In this session we look at these aspects of our lives and explore ways in which our Christian faith helps us find meaning in this.

Session 3: Tuesday 28th May

10am -12 noon Repeat 7.30pm – 9.30pm "Sharing Our Faith with Our Children and Grandchildren"

In the past, faith was considered a static thing – you either had it or you did not. Through the study of psychology we have learned that faith, like so many other areas of our life, undergoes constant change and development. Our Church's expression of faith has also undergone massive changes. In this session we will examine how our faith changes and matures through the stages from childhood to adult faith. We will then explore ways that faith is passed on in families.

Session 4: Wednesday 29th May

10 am – 12 noon Repeat 7.30pm – 9.30pm "Prayer, Solitude and Everyday Spirituality"

In this session we explore the rich variety of prayer styles within our Christian tradition. We look at how we can live out every day spirituality in the ordinariness that makes up most of our lives. We are provided with an experience of guided meditation as a form of Christian prayer.

Session 5: Thursday 30th May

10am – 12 noon Repeat 7.30pm – 9.30pm "Reconciliation and Eucharist"

A Parish Mission is a time of renewal of faith. We focus on the Eucharist, the source and summit of our faith as Catholics. We look at its history and explore its meaning as meal in the context of Jesus' life and ministry. We conclude the mission with a celebration of the Reconciliation.


