### Our Gospel Challenge this week is to: show your love for others by being generous

Food for the multitudes. After feeding the crowds with the loaves and fishes blessed by Jesus, his disciples gathered twelve baskets of leftovers. Jesus, the generous giver, always provides too much, a sign that his gifts are never meant to be hoarded but shared with others. Seeing the poor and hungry of our world, he says to us what he said to the disciples, "give them something to eat yourselves.' Nourished by his body and blood in the Eucharist, let us go out and generously share our gifts with others.

#### Points of interest and Catholic lore

- The actions of our eucharistic celebration are based on the actions of Jesus in this gospel text and later at the Last Supper: the priest takes the bread, blesses it, breaks it and distributes to all who come to the table.
- The twelve baskets full of remaining food signify that the Eucharist can meet all our needs. The abundance of the Eucharist is enough, indeed more than enough, to fill and sustain us.

#### Computational & Algorithmic Thinking Competition (CAT)

Maths Extension Education

In Term 1, ten students were selected from Yr 5 and 6 (upper primary) to compete in the Computational and Algorithmic Thinking (CAT) competition at St John's. It is a one-hour problem-solving competition which seeks to identify computer programming potential. Some questions test the ability to accurately perform procedures, others require logical thought, while the more challenging problems require the identification and application of algorithms. In the weeks leading up to the competition the students practiced on trial material. The results for St John's were outstanding, where Will Adams was awarded a distinction and in the top 11 percent of the competition. Five students received a credit certificate. Congratulations to all participants who worked diligently on the challenging problems.
