Our Gospel Challenge this week is to: stand up for what we think is right!

Jesus almost sounds sad in this weekend's Gospel passage. Maybe this story recalls one of the first times he realised people wouldn't accept his Good News. Maybe that reality crushed him.

I've seen that happen to a lot of people after meetings, retreats, or community service trips. They feel filled with Good News but run into friends and family members who call them unrealistic, naïve, or Bible-bashers. I've also seen conflict sparked when young people stand up for what's right, in front of friends or classmates.

Yeah, Jesus was right. Conflict is definitely part of the package. The peace Jesus brings isn't a calm in which no one gets angry. Jesus makes it clear he stands for the peace that can come only when all people find respect and justice. But the people who call others to respect all people and to live justly – hopefully, us – quite often spark conflict.

Conflict is part of the deal for Christians. And it can get ugly. But the Lord had been through it and won't leave us in the lurch.

When have you seen Christian living spark conflict with friends and family? How will we deal with conflict as Christians?

Living With Parkinsons Disease

Thank you to Jack and his Social Justice Team members who led activities on Friday at lunch time to raise awareness for Parkinson's Disease. Jack had organised three activities so that everyone could experience, to a small degree, what Parkinsons Disease is like. Students had to write their names with their non-preferred hand on a whiteboard, button up a shirt with mittens on and complete a jigsaw with mittens on. Jack made 'Rocky Road' for all participants to share, as he thought "Rocky Road' could also describe the journey of a person living with Parkinson's Disease. Jack and his family also participated in A Walk in the Park, beginning at Federation Park on the weekend.


